You will be completing the following for your Digital Story:

- A Storyboard
- A Digital Presentation

Directions:

- Projects must be submitted by June 20, 2018. Any projects submitted after that date will not be accepted.
- You must be between the ages of 12 and 18 years of age.
- Include your name, age, address, email, local church and Pastor, Jurisdiction and Prelate in the body of the email.

- Work must be your own and not copied from a website or created by someone else. (You are allowed to ask for help if you do not understand how to do something.)

- Projects can only be created in Powerpoint, KeyNotes, iMovie or Windows Movie Maker.
- You do not have to attend the AIM Convention to be considered as part of the competition.
- The winner will receive a medallion, have his/her work placed on the SMM website and will be announced at the SMM Award Ceremony on the Friday of the Convention.

Attached are requirements. Feel free to go beyond those requirements. These are the minimal requirements needed to complete the task. Uniqueness and creativity are encouraged. **Remember - Use all of your skills and creativity!**

A Music Storyboard

1. Select one of the songs from the list below that you feel will best tell our story:
 - All I Have to Give by Mali Music

- Victory by Ricky Dillard
- For Your Glory by Tasha Hobbs
- Cycles by Jonathan McReynolds
- Young by Andy Mineo

2. Find the lyrics and print them out. This will be the guide for your storyboard.
3. Create a **Storyboard**
 - a. Find and download a storyboard template.
 - b. Brainstorm a general plan for illustrating the song. Think in terms of what you have available to incorporate. You can find pictures on the internet; interview friends and family, etc.
 - c. Fill out the storyboard template to be turned in with your presentation.
4. Begin to assemble your slides, pictures or clips. You don't have to create them in order of the lyrics of the song. Create your own story from the lyrics in any order.
5. Most slides should have lyrics.
6. Don't forget that it's OK to add "filler" slides (color or patterns) as transitions between your ideas. Especially if you need more time.
7. Insert your song into the story.
8. If you use Powerpoint or Keynote, all slides have to transition automatically (without mouse click).
9. Send in your storyboard and presentation.
