Raising Consciousness: An Alliance for Education, Prevention, and Opportunity

COGIC Urban Initiatives *Education* CUI) and The National Alliance for Faith and Justice (NAFJ), in forging its unique collaborative, has as its mission to extend the arms of local ministries into civic communities, surrounding neighborhoods, schools, and institutions - and not without a full slate of activities which work best for their population, location, and optimal delivery hours. NAFJ's *PEN or PENCIL Mentoring Program* illustrates specific implementation steps that actualize one model generalizable from ministries and organizations, to the local church in its vision for dynamism in touching neighborhood.

This initiative has as its underlying point that for some students, academic failure produces frustration and poor study habits - and vice versa. In this session, COGIC Urban Initiatives *Education* is spotlighting a "best practice" model that includes training, professional development, and awareness of education resources available to *PEN or PENCIL*. In keeping with the respective missions of COGIC Urban Initiatives *Education* and The National Alliance for Faith and Justice, this national training session targets pastors, ministers, and ministry and organization leaders, local churches, and organization administrators.
