

Context

We all know the liberative story in the book of Exodus - Moses speaks God-breathed truth to pharaoh: "Let my people go!" After Moses tells Pharaoh to free the slaves, Moses didn't give up. He didn't negotiate. Moses settles for nothing less than full liberation for his people.

Fast forward to today. Just as pharaoh didn't want to let the slaves go, there are modern-day pharaohs who want to suppress the rights of others to vote.

In 2012, more African Americans and Latinos voted in the election than ever before. During the 12 years since that election, the 1965 Voting Rights Act was nullified by the Supreme Court and in 38 states, some interest groups and legislators have passed or attempted to pass voter suppression measures to make it more difficult for Black and Brown voters, young voters and senior voters to participate in the democratic process. The enormous amount of money and time that some interest groups' and legislators' have spent in their attempt to silence us has exposed the truth - our votes really do count. And in the 2024 election, we have the opportunity to say WE WILL register to vote, WE WILL not be intimidated, and WE WILL turn out in record numbers for the November election, and WE WILL vote in person, by mail, or by absentee ballot.

Let's work together!

• Voter Registration Weekend

In an act of solidarity, COGIC congregations across the nation are registering ALL eligible voters in their church. This will mean that some people will re-register to vote; however there is no consequence of re-registering to vote, re-registering to vote is not fraudulent. By re-registering to vote we are telling those who are determined to deny our vote, that we are even more determined to register and VOTE. Join us in registering your entire congregation quickly, reverently and in order! The Vote.org platform will provide us the tools that we need to unify and reinforce our strength in every step of the voting process.

• Volunteer to Register VOTERS

We are going to contact members at home or wherever they may be throughout the community to register voters. Vote.org technology will allow us to accomplish this goal more efficiently and effectively

• Protect Our VOTE

Protect the vote on election day! Clergy and other leaders are needed to stand outside polling places, wearing clerical attire as poll workers - to serve as trusted leaders who are dedicated to and trained in protecting people from voter intimidation.

Sample Bulletin Announcements

Sample 1

As we approach this crucial election on November 5th (church name) is joining Presiding Bishop J. Drew Sheard and the General Board in a voter engagement movement called: **The Presiding Bishop's COGIC Counts Initiative.** Through the initiative, we will lead a nationwide, strategic campaign that raises awareness about the importance of African American people gaining political power through voting, we will register all members who are eligible to vote in our congregations and our surrounding communities, we will VOTE in record numbers this year, and we will vote either in person, by mail, or by absentee ballot. To demonstrate our determination to make our voice heard through our vote (Date) is Voter Registration Sunday. So (Church Name) along with other COGIC congregations across the nation are registering ALL members in our churches who are eligible to vote (Are you an U.S. citizen who is 18 years of age or older and not on parole? *Please check your state's voter eligibility requirements concerning whether people who have committed a felony, or are on parole or on probation are eligible to vote* Then you are eligible to vote! We are even reregistering some people to vote- there is no consequence of reregistering to vote, re-registering to vote is not fraudulent. By reregistering to vote, we are telling those who are determined to deny our vote, that we are even more determined to register and VOTE. So please invite family, neighbors, friends, co-workers to (Church Name) next Sunday! Please visit Vote.org for voter registration and re-registration instructions.

Working Together to Register All Eligible Voters

In 2012 more African American people voted than ever. During the past 12 years, in <u>38 states</u> specific interest groups and legislators have passed or attempted to pass voter suppression measures that make it more difficult for African American and Latino voters, young voters and senior voters to participate in the democratic process.

In this decisive moment in history, COGIC congregations across the nation are working together on a voter engagement movement: **The Presiding Bishop's COGIC Counts Initiative**/

Through the initiative, COGIC congregations will raise awareness about attempts to discourage African American voters and the importance of increasing the number of and protecting African American vote. Congregations will register African American voters throughout the state and African Americans will vote in record numbers in the November election.

"Through the initiative, COGIC congregations are saying WE WILL not be silenced, we will vote in record numbers and our votes will count."

"Heal me, Lord, and I will be healed, save me and I will be saved, for you are the one I praise" Jeremiah 17:14





LEARN: How To Prepare Your House of Worship

PRAY: Pray now until election day 2024.

CONDUCT: Post on Social Media encouraging voter turnout.

HOST: Host Turnout Sunday Service (Sunday, November 3, 2024)


PLAN: Plan transportation for elderly & disabled members to vote.

POST: Post Polling Sites & changes up to Election Day

WATCH: Have your faith leaders visit polling sites of your members.

ADOPT: Adopt a precinct near you church.

CANVAS: Go door to door in your community to encourage voting



IRS GUIDELINES

IRS GUIDELINES FOR HOUSES OF WORSHIP

DO: Publish news stories about campaigns...the congregation must be kept informed as best as possible. Also, discuss candidates position on issues with congregation.

DO: Rent out the faith organization facilities (e.g. kitchens, athletic facilities, community rooms) for political activities...regular rates MUST apply.

DO: Provide rentals of membership lists at regular rates.

DO: Allow candidates to make appearances at the organization's events/services.

DO: Distribute candidate campaign literature as an individual faith leader.

DO: Distribute candidate surveys and/or voting records of office holders.

DO: Publish political ads; Apply regular rates.

DO: Use organization's vehicle to transport voter.

DO: Lobby & Campaign for or against legislation as congregation or individual.

DO NOT: Support or oppose the candidates on the congregation's behalf.

DO NOT: Use the congregation's funding to give financial contributions of any kind to the candidates/office holders.

DO NOT: Impose your opinions on the congregation.

DO NOT: Publish faith organization editorials that support or oppose candidates.

DO NOT: Publish political ads as a donation.

DO NOT: Display candidate's literature on organization's vehicle used to transport people to vote.

DO NOT: Distribute candidate campaign literature as a congregation.
